

Governance

Aragami gives high priority on good governance, accountability and transparency operating according to the approved constitution of the organisation. It has two-tier structure namely (1) general body and (2) governing body. General body comprises a group of social minded women. The general body consisting of 21 members holds at least one general meeting annually in a transparent and democratic process. The general body approves all the activities of the governing body. the general body members elected 9 members governing body after every alternative three years.

The governing body is the supreme authority to frame policies, guidelines and decision to run the organization. The governing body members are continually contributing to organizational growth and development by providing their valuable advice and suggestions in the formulation of policies and guidelines. The general body holds at least four meetings in a year.

Managing Committee :

The Managing Committee, comprising of Mrs. Sujata Mandal Secretary, Ms. Lilabati Mahata, President, and Ms. Bijita Sandil, Treasurer, has been entrusted with the task of carrying out the daily operation of Purulia Agragami and has the power to exercise any power and function of the Governing Body except those related to approval of appointment of any new member of the Governing Body or those relating to framing/changing/amending of the bylaws, rules or regulations.

The Year in Retrospect

Holistic development approach has always been the key for implementing projects and programs for Agragami. The year 2019-20 was different from every other years. But still Agragami found a way two step forward fulfilling the mission of the organisation. Most of the programs and projects have been implemented with the financial assistance of the the development partners and or government agencies and private sector while some are exclusively from its own resources. Here are the glimpses of the major programs of Agragami:

Mobile Medical Unit (MMU)



The Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) is a key strategy by National Health Mission (NHM) to facilitate access to public health care particularly to people living in remote, difficult, underserved and unreached areas. The objective of the strategy is to take healthcare to the doorsteps of population particularly rural, vulnerable and underserved areas.

Aragami has been entrusted to implement the mobile medical unit project in three blocks namely Saltora and Khatra of Bankura and Jhalda of Purulia. The services are governed by 3 vehicles (4 wheelers) to offer medical checkup, consultation, provision of free medicine, diagnostic and conducting medical counseling etc. The MMUs are assigned with the task of delivering primary health care in remote areas which included curative reproductive diagnostic and radiology services for one day in a week. All the MMUs currently operating are having a qualified medical officer, nurse, lab technician, pharmacist and x-ray technician.

Rogi Sahayata Kendra

In our present health system, sharing and disseminating information about proper health services has always been an issue. So, to help the patient parties about all the government health facilities including Primary Health Centre, Block Primary Health Centre, District Hospital, Rural Hospital etc., Agragami has instituted and successfully run 10 numbers of RogiSahayataKendras



(RSKs) in BHCs under Jhalda and Raghunathpur Subdivision and at Raghunathpur Sub-Divisional Hospital, Purulia under NRHM and Government of West Bengal. Agragami provides easy access to required information about the available health services facilities to all clients and stakeholders and assures patients and relatives that they can get necessary information on a real time basis to help them to get the services instantly. It reduces the gap between the patients and doctors and thus decreases the misunderstandings between two parties as well. It leverages a better environment for assuring health services and looks carefully towards the patients' satisfaction.

Main Activities:

- Easier access for patients of health services without harassment
- Raise patient satisfaction
- Reduce conflicts between health service providers and patient parties
- Providing accurate information in an easier way about the health services and facilities
- Provide patient related information to patient parties on a regular basis and guide them about available services
- Helping the service providers also by guiding the patient parties and visitors

Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP)

Tuberculosis (TB) is not only a major medical issue but also a social stigma in India. Every year 1.96 million new cases are found who are suffering from this disease. 3,30,000 people die every year due to TB, i.e. over 1000 people die every day because of these deadly disease. Under Revised Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP), Agragami has addressed the control of spreading tuberculosis within a community. To assure that, Agragami has taken several measures to implement sustainable tuberculosis control plan which are as follows:

- ACSM at community level
- ACSM for youth
- Improving TB control in urban slum areas
- Sputum collection and transportation
and
- Contact tracing

Under RNTCP, Agragami has covered a population of 9,31,363 in 19 municipal wards and 48 gram panchayats of Jaypur, Sonamukhi, Indus, Patrasayer, Kotulpur block and in in Radhanagar GP along with Bishnupur Municipality of Bishnupur Health District.

Link Workers Scheme (LWS)

The Link Worker Scheme proposed under National AIDS Control Programme III has been designed specifically to address populations with high-risk behaviours (including High Risk Groups and Bridge Populations) with the promise that there are significant numbers in rural areas and we needs to be reach out to them in order to saturate the coverage of these groups. In partnership with West Bengal State AIDS Prevention and Control Society (WBSAP&CS), Health and Family Welfare Department of Government of West Bengal and NACO, Agragami has been implementing the Link Workers Scheme (LWS) project for high risk group population and their sources since 2016. A total of 3,50,189 people have been covered under this project at hundred villages in 15 blocks of PaschimMedinipur district.

The core objective of the program is aimed to halt and reverse the epidemic by integrating and collaborating programs for prevention, care, support and to address the issues like condom promotion through distribution and motivation, social marketing, developing Inter-Personal Behaviour Changes Communication, community mobilization and IEC activities, health camp organisation for referral and linkage service, linkage to Integrated Counselling and Testing Centres (ICTC), creation of enabling environment through advocacy etc.



Under this project Agragami has taken different activities in this year which are as follows:

Condom Promotion

3As are most important aspects for condom promotion. These are: accessibility availability and affordability. Using this 3A method, the intervention has planned for promotion of correct and consistent use of condom among the target population groups. For increasing access to the condom, free condoms has supplied by the project. Besides the CLWs and LVs are also supplying free condoms as per their estimated demand regularly during counselling sessions.

Advocacy Meeting



A total of 94 advocacy meetings have been conducted to raise awareness among government and institutional stakeholders. Among the participants there were Pradhan, Upa-pradhan, GP Member, Political Leader, BPHN, PHN, ANM, BDO, Club Secretary & Member, BMOH, Medical Officer, Swasthya Karmadhakya, Group Leader of SHG, Head Master, ICDS Supervisor, CDPO and Executive Officer of GP.

In a total 2022 personnel attended the advocacy meetings. This was an attempt to build a community ownership of the LWS objectives. So community mobilization was an important aspect of these activities.

Local Village Level Meetings

Local village level meetings were also organised to raise awareness among villagers who are considered as the local stakeholders. Marginal people and people associated with different field of works and vulnerable to unsafe sex were majorly covered through this activity. Total of 5499 people attended the meetings among which there were migrants, spouses of migrants, truckers, truckers' spouses, FSWs, SHG members, TB patients, Youth Groups, ANC mothers, general people, club members etc. Along with these, a number of stigma reduction meetings, co-ordination and facilitation of PLHA meetings, staff review meetings were held also.

Health Camps

In this financial year, a total of 16 health camps have been organised in the outreach areas as per the need of the community in the inaccessible areas with the support from the officials of the health department along with local public representatives like MLAs, PRI representatives and other dignitaries. They were also present in these camps to encourage the local people including the targeted population of the community to participate in these health camps. General medical checkups including ICTC tests were done also in those camps with prior importance.



Observation of World AIDS Day

With all respect and grandeur, World AIDS Day was observed in the district headquarter of Medinipore town. A huge rally was organised followed by an intense workshop. Leaflets, posters and key rings containing messages on HIV/AIDS developed by Agragami were distributed among participants and general people also to generate the awareness on this issue among them.



Adolescent Intervention Program (AIP)

Adolescent Intervention Program (AIP) is actually empowering the adolescents by ensuring their rights and fundamentals. The program has been designed by UNICEF with support from Purulia District Administration. AIP program has been introduced in the Purulia district to improve the adolescent's life and future, who are in the age group of 10 to 19 years. The strategy has been set here to achieve better outcomes in the aspect of adolescent's development, health and nutrition, education, protection and empowerment through information and skill development. Agradami is implementing the project at Purulia-II block and Jhalda Municipality since 2015.

National Rural Drinking Water Quality Monitoring And Surveillance Programme



To provide pure drinking water, it is extremely important to maintain and monitor the quality and regular surveillance. For that, Aragami is implementing National Rural Drinking Water Quality Monitoring and Surveillance Programme at 131 villages covering a population of 1,37,143 in Jhalda-I block since 2007. Here the laboratory is run with financial and technical support from Public Health Engineering Department of Government of West Bengal. Initially the setup was in action with assistance from the UNICEF under the Fluoride Mitigation Program.

Still in the present days, drinking water is a burning issue in most of the rural areas of Purulia. Hand pump fitted tube Wells are still the major drinking water sources there. But, as there have no proper drainage system for disposal of wastewater, that results contamination of groundwater sources. To improve the situation and ensure pure drinking water for the villagers, Agragami implemented 'Construction of soak pit, surface drain and platform in 110 numbers of tube wells for liquid waste management from spot source including training and IEC' in several gram panchayats under Neturia block of Purulia district. The program is a CSR initiative of PHE department with Coal India Limited and SIPL.



Creche Services



Children are the future citizens of the country. So, the proper maintenance and wellbeing is extremely required to secure our country's future. To ensure that, Agragami has been running two numbers of Chreche Centres at Kulajanga and Jargo village under Jhalda-I block of Purulia district since 1997. It looks after 50 children aged between 2-5 years of working and ailing mothers. Here children are provided

Balwadi education training, regular health check up with medical care and immunization along with supplementary nutrition and support from the Social Welfare Department of Government of West Bengal.

Other Welfare Activities

Plastic Free Jhalda and Water Conservation Program on World Environment Day



AGRAGAMI has performed an Awareness Rally about Water Conservation and Plastic Free Jhalda with a focus on SAVE WATER, SAVE LIFE campaign.

The program was implemented by eminent representatives from District Administration, Head of the Institutions of different Schools and supported by different Kanyashree Clubs. The program took place in Jhalda town of Purulia with more than 100 adolescent girls and others from the community.

Hon'ble SDO of Jhalda flagged off the Rally with his most valuable and relevant deliberations and appealed everyone to come forward to save water. He pointed the importance of it as it is the question to save our future as well as to save our planet. Among the other speakers, Head Mistress of Jhalda Girls High School also appealed to Save Water as every drop of water is extremely precious.



After the Rally some demands were placed on behalf of AGRAGAMI before the Hon'ble Chairman, Jhalda Municipality related to Water Conservation like fitting fixing of stopcocks in each and every water stand posts; arrangement of ground water recharging with rainwater, to make Jhalda plastic-free zone etc. The response from the chairman was very positive with assurance to take

immediate measures in this regard. The eminent guests also raised their voices supporting AGRAGAMI's demand to make Jhalda a plastic-free zone. It is now known to everybody that how plastics can cause harm to the nature and environment. But still there is lack of motivation and awareness. The speakers also highlighted the issue and assured to take necessary steps. Following that the usage of plastics were controlled thereafter. The participation from especially the Kanyashree Club Members with their supreme energy and vision made the program a grand success.

Distribution of Clothes for Needy and Deprived



Food, Clothing and Shelter are three most important units of requirement in someone's life. There are disaster victims, underprivileged people, and children in need of clothing. Agragami raised social demand of empathy in front of others that their useless things can come in great use of some other people. A huge collection of clothing

was gathered through this campaign which was eventually distributed among the needy and deprived people of several areas. People participated wholeheartedly in these and in a number of cases they provided new clothes as well.

Celebrating of Different Special Days

1. Universal Health Coverage Day



Universal Health Coverage Day is celebrated annually on December 12 and is promoted by the World Health Organization with the resolution of providing the



citizens affordable, quality health care. Supporting the cause of right to health, AGRAGAMI organised huge rally in Jhalda-1 block. Huge number of participants attended the rally among which there were Kanyashree Members, Sabala Members, members from Health Department and representatives from Police Department. Another rally was organised at Tulin of Jhalda. A workshop was organised focusing this at Purulia-II block. Among the speakers there were the BDO of the block, the Sabhapati of the PanchayatSamiti, the CDPO, the BMOH, the Health Supervisor and others.

2. Children's Day

Children's Day is celebrated across India to increase awareness of the rights, care and education of children. With all the Kanyashree members, Children's Day was celebrated at the Chandai Anganwadicentre. A vast discussion took place on the rights and security of the children. The program initiated with sending gratitude to the first prime minister of India Sri Jawaharlal Nehru. Another program was also organised at Jhalda Hindi High Uchha Vidyalaya with the support from their Kanyashree Club. This program was an initiative of the Adolescent Intervention Program. A number of cultural activities were performed in this program pointing the rights and laws associated with that for children.



3. Rakhi Bandhan Utsav and Independence Day Celebration



Being the proud citizens of India, Agragami as the organisation has always celebrated the Independence Day of India offering respect and gratitude to the noble hearts who have fought for the nation. Several numbers of students, general people and members of Agragami participated in this celebration. They took part in the discussion forum and also took oath to lead the society towards a better one. Also in this occasion the festival of unity and brotherhood, 'Rakhi Bandhan' was also celebrated. Kanyashree members along with members of Agragami tied Rakhi in the hands of people and passengers to convey the message of the holy day.

4. Observance of Menstrual Health Management Day



To break taboos surrounding menstruation, raise awareness of the importance of good menstrual hygiene management worldwide.

Menstrual Hygiene Day is an annual awareness day on May 28 to highlight the importance of good menstrual hygiene management (MHM). Like previous years, this year also

Aragami came forward to celebrate the Menstrual Hygiene Day which was held at Jhalda Community Hall and Purulia-2 block.

In presence of the BMOH, PHN, ICDS supervisor, Counselor under Adolescent Intervention Program several discussion forums and cultural activities took place. To engage youths, programs like quiz, drama, speech and drawing competition were also organised.



5. Journey Towards Cleanliness



Cleanliness is most important for physical well-being and a healthy environment. It has bearing on public and personal hygiene. 
